All school districts, individual schools, or charter schools are prohibited from contracting with or making any payment to any third party for material concerning any of the above topics. Until this prohibition goes into effect, sexual education shall only utilize sexual risk avoidance programs and promote abstinence outside of marriage."




- All orgasms are "outlets" and equal between husband and wife, boy and dog, man and boy, girl, or baby — for there is no abnormality and no normality.
- As the aim of coitus is orgasm, the **more orgasms** from any "outlet," at the earliest age- the **healthier** the person.
- **Masturbation** is critical for sexual, physical and emotional health. It can never be excessive or pathological.
- All sexual taboos and sex laws are routinely broken; thus all taboos and **sex laws should be eliminated**, including that of rape, unless serious "force" is used.
- Since sex is, can, and should be commonly shared with anyone and anything, jealousy is passé.
- All sexual experimentation before marriage will increase the likelihood of a successful long-term marriage and venereal disease and other disorders will be reduced dramatically.
- People left on their own are **naturally bisexual**. Religious bigotry and prejudice forces people into heterosexuality and monogamy.

- Homosexuals represent ten to thirty-seven percent of the population or more.



"Evidence-Based"

Programs become **"Evidence Based"** through <u>expensive</u> clinical trials that do <u>social experiments</u> on children, require a <u>control</u> group as well as a test group, create a <u>monopoly</u> with high barriers to entry, and result in <u>static</u> content that must be implemented with <u>fidelity</u> to replicate promised results.

Proposed Language by Democrats in Texas

In this section, "evidence-based" means information verified or supported by research that is:

- (1) conducted in compliance with accepted scientific methods;
- (2) published in peer-reviewed journals, if appropriate;
- 3) recognized as medically accurate, objective, and complete by mainstream professional organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field, including the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the United States Department of Health and Human Services; and
- (4) proven through rigorous scientific evaluation to achieve positive outcomes on measures of sexual risk behavior or its health consequences.

Proposed Conservative Language in the U.S. H.R. 453 Healthy Relationships Act 2015

The term 'evidence-based approach' means an approach that—

- (A) has a clear theoretical framework integrating research findings with practical implementation relevant to the field;
- (B) matches the needs and desired outcomes for the intended audience; and
- (C) if effectively implemented, will demonstrate improved outcomes for the targeted population.

Human Sexuality Instruction in Texas



Texas Education Code 28.004

Trustees must "consider recommendations" from the SHAC

School Districts

- may not distribute condoms in connection with human sexuality instruction
- may separate students according to sex
- shall provide written notice of instruction
- must provide materials for reasonable public inspection

Parents

- may opt out student without penalty
- may file a grievance if School District does not provide written notice of instruction and provide materials for reasonable public inspection

The Texas Education Code 28.004 requires any Human Sexuality Instruction to:

- (1) present **abstinence** from sexual activity as the **preferred** choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity **for unmarried** persons of school age;
- devote more attention to abstinence from sexual activity than to any other behavior;
- (3) emphasize that **abstinence** from sexual activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method that is **100 percent effective** in preventing pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma associated with adolescent sexual activity;
- (4) direct adolescents to a standard of behavior in which **abstinence from sexual activity before marriage** is the most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and infection with human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome; and
- (5) teach **contraception and condom use in terms of human use reality rates** instead of theoretical laboratory rates, if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in curriculum content.

Human Sexuality
Instruction is **NOT**mandatory



School Health Advisory Council (SHAC)

- Citizen Committee required in Texas Education Code 28.004 for every School District
- Members may be appointed by Trustees
- Majority of members must be parents of students in the district
- Provides advice to the district on coordinated school health programming
- "Assists the district in ensuring that local community values are reflected in the district's health education instruction"


We are sometimes questioned why we put our abstinence message in the context of marriage. The real question is: Why, wouldn't you put any discussion of sexual intimacy in the context of marriage if you are committed to giving young people the best advantage for health and well being? Documented evidence shows that the indicators measuring societal health demonstrate that when sexual activity takes place in the context of marriage the outcomes are overwhelmingly beneficial for parents and children. In addition to enhanced emotional support, some of these positive outcomes include vastly lower poverty rates, better academic success and lower rates of crime, incarceration, child abuse and domestic violence. The institution of marriage is clearly a protective factor.

THEREFORE: Any educational program for school aged children that does not discuss sexual activity in the context of marriage or at a minimum the benefits of waiting, practices a form of Advantage Discrimination that is unacceptable for America's youth. All students deserve to receive information that will give them the best advantage for a life of health and well-being. To this end, there should be no participation in "the soft bigotry of low expectations". We must proactively seek to empower students to remain sexually abstinent until marriage as a "best practice" approach for their future success. We do not and will not engage in Advantage Discrimination!


Pro-Life States Have Lower Abortion Rates

Pregnancy Rate (15-19)



Age Appropriate

"Age appropriate" means topics, messages, and teaching methods suitable to particular ages or age groups of children or adolescents, based on developing cognitive, emotional, and behavioral capacity typical for the age or age group.

Age Appropriate: topics suitable for a given age group, based on the general developmental and social maturity of the age group. Mere cognitive ability to understand a topic or the atypical development of a small segment of the targeted population will **not** be deemed as license to present such topic.

Big Decisions

"While called an "abstinence-plus" curriculum, Big Decisions: Making Healthy, Informed Choices about Sex (volume 4) gives little credence to abstinence, failing to set abstinence as a standard or even to promote or teach the benefits of delaying sexual debut.

Instead, Big Decisions targets children 13- to 15-years old with shrewdly cloaked content, including "fun-sounding" games and role plays, to prepare children, and even encourage them, to be sexually active."

BREAKING: Nearly two years to the day that Fort Worth ISD announced its infamous transgender policy, parents discovered the District has been teaching 5,000 sixth graders per year in, among other things, transgender ideology since 2016— despite the District's repeal of the transgender policy.

Parents at the McLean 6th Grade campus recently started hearing jaw-dropping reports from their students' health class. At the beginning of the school year, parents received a state-mandated Notice of Intent to Provide Human Sexuality Instruction.

Sounds good...except when students recently started coming home and sharing what they were learning it didn't match up with the Notice. Students were told by school officials they could not take the Health textbook home. They were even instructed not to take pictures of it in class. At least one child was told to stop "tattling" to his parents. And at least one parent was denied access to the book by their child's teachers. These actions raised additional concerns.
