Our Mission:

To protect and promote the family as the fundamental unit of society through education, pro-family advocacy, and family-based humanitarian aid.

Our Core Objectives:

To protect the family by preserving and promoting traditional marriage, safeguarding parental rights, defending human life, upholding religious liberty, and protecting the health and innocence of children.

Our Unique Approach:

The Family Watch UN Program

"Promoting family-based solutions to world problems"

Family Watch regularly facilitates pro-family outcomes in UN policy documents negotiated and adopted by UN Member States that impact families worldwide. Family Watch serves as a UN watchdog, exposing harmful agendas and rallying family-friendly countries to stop them.

Examples of highly successful Family Watch UN initiatives include:

Global Family Policy Forums

Family Watch hosts Global Family Policy Forums annually, bringing together key UN ambassadors and diplomats for two days of expert presentations and discussions on family issues. These Forums have been recognized by UN diplomats, major media outlets, and other observers for having a direct impact on UN negotiations in favor of the family.

UN Family Rights Caucus

Under FWI's leadership, this Caucus has successfully promoted and helped secure the adoption by the UN Human Rights Council of a series of groundbreaking resolutions on the protection of the family. To learn more, visit <u>UNFRC.org</u>.



UN Family Resource Guide

FWI's most powerful tool for protecting the family internationally is our UN Resource Guide, a compendium of the best family-supportive language from UN treaties and major UN consensus documents. Updated annually with new research, the Guide also contains effective social science-based talking points on multiple family and life issues that have been used successfully by governments on the UN floor during negotiations to effect pro-family outcomes.

UN Events & Private Diplomat Briefings

FWI has held numerous events at the UN in partnership with UN Member States both in New York and in Geneva. FWI also has been invited to give private briefings on family issues to various UN voting blocs, including to governments representing Caribbean, African, and Islamic nations.

FWI Insider Phone App

Family Watch's Insider phone app is very popular among UN delegates because it has a searchable database of UN documents, an electronic copy of our UN Resource Guide, and links to other Family Watch policy tools. This app is used regularly by UN delegates during UN negotiations, as it provides instant access to key data, documents, and pro-family policy arguments.





Family Watch's "Protect Child Health" Initiative

"Protecting the health and innocence of children worldwide"

Ensuring a healthy future for the family requires securing a healthy future for our children who will form the next generation. One of the greatest threats to the health and innocence of children worldwide is Comprehensive Sex (or Sexuality) Education (CSE). These CSE programs, often promoted through schools, can sexualize children and lead them into a lifetime of negative outcomes that jeopardize their ability to form stable families in the future.

Family Watch is known as a world leader in exposing the dangers of CSE and has been instrumental in halting or deleting CSE provisions in draft laws and policies in a number of countries and U.S. states and in multiple UN resolutions.



The Stop CSE Alliance

The Stop CSE Alliance, founded and led by Family Watch, is a coalition open to all those who work to increase awareness and strengthen individual, government and community efforts to stop Comprehensive Sex Education. This growing alliance is currently composed of committed organizations and individuals in more than 70 countries working to stop the indoctrination and sexualization of children through CSE. The Alliance website, www.stopCSE.org, posts resources, tools and information to aid efforts to protect children from CSE programs.

War on Children Documentary

One of the most influential projects Family Watch has ever launched is the popular documentary, "The War on Children: The Comprehensive Sexuality Education Agenda." This widely acclaimed film documents how UN agencies, certain Western governments and Planned Parenthood, along with their allies, are working to destroy the sexual norms and gender roles of society through CSE. It also exposes specific CSE programs in the U.S. and abroad that are stealing the innocence of children by sexualizing them at very young ages.

"The War on Children" is free to view online at www.StopCSE.org in both a 10-minute and 35-minute version, and has been subtitled in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hungarian, Latvian, Polish, Romanian and Spanish.





Family Watch's "Protect Child Health" Initiative (contin.)



A groundbreaking independent analysis commissioned by Family Watch soundly debunks the common claims made by the U.S. federal Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program, the CDC, UNESCO and other UN agencies that CSE programs have proven to be effective and abstinence programs ineffective in the U.S.

The analysis, titled "Re-examining the Evidence: School-Based Comprehensive Sexuality Education in the United States," found "more evidence of failure than success" for federally-funded CSE programs in U.S. schools. (The full report can be viewed at SexEdReport.org.)

Protect Child Health Annual Summits

Family Watch International hosts Protect Child Health Summits annually, bringing together leaders from across the U.S. to receive training on how to expose and stop the implementation of CSE programs in their states and local communities.








Family Watch Educational Resources and Policy Tools

Family Watch Documentaries

1. War on Children

As noted earlier, this film documents how UN agencies, some Western governments, and Planned Parenthood, along with their allies, are trying to sexualize children through Comprehensive Sex Education programs often promoted through school systems. This hard-hitting documentary is available in a 10-minute and a 35-minute version and with subtitles in many languages. (See at StopCSE.org.)





2. Porn Pandemic

"The Porn Pandemic: The Devastating Effects on Children, Families and Society" focuses on how the brain is affected by the viewing of pornography and how it can lead to the breakdown of the family, prostitution, and other crimes against women and children, including sex trafficking. The film features interviews with experts as well as testimonials from people whose lives have been negatively impacted by pornography. (See <u>PornPandemic.org.</u>)

3. Understanding Same-Sex Attraction

Top mental health experts and researchers explain in this documentary how same-sex attraction may develop and how unwanted same-sex attraction can be treated. It features powerful testimonials from four men who speak about their experiences with same-sex attraction, living the homosexual lifestyle, and how therapy helped them experience healing. 4. The Best Interest of the Child

Every child deserves a family, and this documentary promotes family-based care and adoption for orphans and vulnerable children. It features commentary from experts in this field and follows the experiences of several orphans, highlighting their emotional and inspiring adoption stories. (See Families4Orphans.org.)

5. Cultural Imperialism: The Sexual Rights Agenda

This documentary exposes how UN agencies and some Western donor nations are exploiting the AIDS pandemic, bullying and blackmailing smaller nations to advance their radical sexual rights agenda. African and Caribbean representatives speak out against the imposition of "sexual rights" by certain powerful nations because such rights are eroding their religious and cultural values and destroying their families. 6. The Family & Sustainable Development: Strong Families -Prosperous Nations



Parents are rightly outraged over the **explicit language and graphic content** their children are exposed to by federally funded Comprehensive Sex Education lessons being taught in schools across the country.






Grooming Young Kids for Sex Through Indoctrination

The goal of Comprehensive Sex Education is not to teach our children about healthy family formation and relationships, but rather, to sexualize children from the earliest ages and indoctrinate them with views on sexuality that encourage high-risk sexual behavior.

Rather than educating about healthy behavior and attitudes toward sexuality, Comprehensive Sex Education indoctrinates youth with the idea that sexual promiscuity is normal for teens and is even one of their "human rights.".

"You just need to do it, and then you'll realize sex is no big deal."



Harmful Effects Comprehensive Sex Education Has on Children



1. SEXUALIZES CHILDREN

Normalizes child sex or desensitizes children to sexual things. May give examples of children having sex or imply many of their peers are sexually active. May glamorize sex, use graphic materials, teach explicit sexual vocabulary, or encourage discussion of sexual experiences, attractions, fantasies or desires.

2. TEACHES CHILDREN TO CONSENT TO SEX

May teach children how to negotiate sexual encounters or how to ask for or get "consent" from other children to engage in sexual acts with them.

3. NORMALIZES ANAL & ORAL SEX

Introduces these high-risk sexual behaviors to children and may normalize them. May omit vital medical facts, such as the extremely high STI rates (i.e., HIV and HPV) and oral and anal cancer rates associated with these risky sex acts.

4. PROMOTES HOMOSEXUAL / BISEXUAL BEHAVIOR

Promotes acceptance of and/or exploration of diverse sexual orientations, sometimes in violation of state education laws. May omit vital health information and/or may provide medically inaccurate information about homosexuality or homosexual sex.

5. TEACHES CHILDREN SEXUAL PLEASURE

Teaches children about sexual pleasure. May tell them they are entitled to or have a "right" to sexual pleasure or encourage children to seek out sexual pleasure.

6. PROMOTES SOLO OR MUTUAL MASTURBATION

While masturbation can be part of normal child development, encourages masturbation at young ages, making children more vulnerable to pornography use, sexual addictions or sexual exploitation. May describe masturbation or provide instruction on how to masturbate. May encourage children to engage in mutual masturbation.



Harmful Effects Comprehensive Sex Education Has on Children

7. EROTICIZES CONDOM USE

May use sexually explicit methods (i.e., penis and vagina models, seductive role play, etc.) to promote condom use to children. May provide medically inaccurate information on condom effectiveness and omit or deemphasize failure rates. May imply that condoms will provide complete protection against pregnancy or STIs.

8. PROMOTES EARLY SEXUAL INDEPENDENCE

Teaches children they can choose to have sex when they feel they are ready or when they find a trusted partner. Fails to provide data about the well-documented negative consequences of early sexual debut.

9. FAILS TO ESTABLISH ABSTINENCE AS THE GOAL

Fails to establish abstinence (or a return to abstinence) as the expected standard for all school- age children. May mention abstinence only in passing. May teach children that all sexual activity—other than "unprotected" vaginal and oral sex is acceptable, and even healthy. May present abstinence and "protected" sex as equally good options for children.

10. PROMOTES GENDER CONFUSION

Promotes affirmation of and/or exploration of diverse gender identities. May teach children they can change their gender or identify as multiple genders, or may present other unscientific and medically inaccurate gender ideologies. Fails to teach that most gender-confused children resolve it by adulthood and that extreme gender confusion is a mental health disorder (gender dysphoria) that may be helped with therapy.

11. TEACHES ABORTION / CONTRACEPTION

Presents abortion as a safe or positive option while omitting data on the many potential negative physical and mental health consequences. May teach children they have a right to abortion and refer them to abortion providers. May encourage the use of contraceptives, while failing to present failure rates or side effects.

12. PROMOTES PEER-TO-PEER SEX ED / SEXUAL RIGHTS ADVOCACY

May train children to teach other children about sex or sexual pleasure through peer-to-peer initiatives. May recruit children as spokespeople to advocate for controversial sexual rights (including a right to CSE itself) or to promote abortion.

13. UNDERMINES TRADITIONAL VALUES AND BELIEFS

May encourage children to question their parents' beliefs or their cultural or religious values regarding early sex, sexual orientation or gender identity.

14. VIOLATES OR UNDERMINES PARENTAL RIGHTS

May instruct children they have rights to confidentiality and privacy from their parents. May teach children about accessing sexual commodities or services, including abortion, without parental consent. May instruct children not to tell their parents what they are being taught about sex in school.

15. REFERS CHILDREN TO HARMFUL RESOURCES

Refers children to harmful websites, materials or outside entities. May also specifically refer children to Planned Parenthood or their affiliates or partners for their lucrative services or commodities (i.e., sexual counseling, condoms, contraceptives, gender hormones, STI testing and treatment, abortions, etc.)



Major Family Watch Victories for Children and Families and the Future



Highlights of Recent Family Watch Successes:

- Instrumental in passing a series of landmark Family Protection resolutions at the UN Human Rights Council for three years in a row;
- Established the Stop CSE Project, which is helping people across the U.S. and in many countries across the world remove these harmful programs from their schools;
- Commissioned a landmark analysis exposing the ineffectiveness and harms of school-based CSE programs in the United States. (See <u>SexEdReport.org</u>.)

Planned 2018 Child & Family Protection Initiatives

In late 2017, Family Watch launched a comprehensive outreach awareness initiative targeting policymakers in Washington, DC, that included meetings with members of Congress and high-level officials at federal agencies such as the State Department, Department of Health and Human Services, and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).

In 2018 Family Watch will continue this initiative and other efforts throughout the world by, among other things:

- 1. Working with our government contacts to help redirect millions of foreign aid funding to family-friendly programs at home and abroad.
- 2. Continuing leadership efforts at the international level through sponsoring the upcoming Global Family Policy Forum and regional World Congress of Family events and briefings.
- 3. Producing multiple powerful short documentaries (five to seven minutes in length) for social media on critical family-related topics.
- 4. Creating a full-length documentary to help people understand the real facts regarding transgender challenges.
- 5. Working to remove exemptions in state obscenity laws that currently enable obscene CSE programs to be given to young children in U.S. schools.
